Sight-a-thon 2018 / Blindfold Walk / Eye Donation Awareness Walk

An All India, Revolutionary Movement for the cause of Eyes Donation under the flagship program of CAMBA (Cornea Andhaktv Mukh Bharath Abhiyan) in Partnership with NPCB (National Programme for Control of Blindness, Govt. of India). Started in the year of 2017.

During the Sightathon events across India, normal sighted people are blindfolded with a piece of opaque cloth. The Blindfolded participants are made to walk for a distance of two kilometers, usually guided by a visually challenged person.

SAKSHAM VISION – Year 2008

The aims and objectives of the organization shall be Educational, Cultural, & Social Fields.

1. To do all such things and adopt all such means as are calculated to uplift the moral social, cultural, financial by way of scholarship, and physical conditions of Visually challenged & Physically challenged and differently abled persons and cooperate and coordinate similar other organizations as far as practicable.
2. To make and assist sightless persons to become active and useful citizen of the country; enable to participate in national reconstruction.
3. To employ and utilize the services of V.C.P.C persons for progress of the country by exploring the govt. opportunities as well as non-Govt. opportunities for employment of V.C.P.C persons.
4. To establish, maintain and carry on suitable Institution or Centers of Educational and Vocational training of V.C.P.C persons. In the field of arts, science, industry, & agriculture etc.
5. To establish, maintain and carry on hostel-cum-workshop where the V.C.P.C persons, boys and girls can reside and can earn their livelihood. To organize integrated education for V.C.P.C persons.
6. To assist and carry out the programs of prevention and cure of V.C.P.C persons.
7. To improve the quality of education establish, run & maintain Pre-primary, Primary, Middle School, High School & colleges of every faculty like Arts, Commerce, Science, Medical, Engineering, Technical Education, Teacher Education, D.Ed., Teacher Training & Research in educational field for betterment of all child & women in particular. Non-formal education. Run Schools, colleges, residential schools for improvement persons belonging to S.C, S.T, VJ & N.T.
8. To Provide facilities for V.C.P.C. persons
 - i) Running Educational centers
 - ii) Providing libraries
 - iii) Providing Development Centers
 - iv) Providing Health care Centers
9. To improve the Quality of Life of the society in general
 - i) Organizing Adult education Centers both for Men & Women.
 - ii) Providing guidance, establishing & running bachat gat & self-help group for V.C.P.C
 - iii) Organizing special programs for family planning, prohibition, Drug Abuse prevention, AIDs Awareness, Environmental Development
 - iv) Bringing awareness about the necessity of generating the opportunity for self-employment and self help
 - v) Running schools in the field of traditional occupations and artisanship to stop migration to urban centers
10. Provide medical help to the poor and deserving persons of any community during epidemic, famine, flood or unforeseen calamity.
11. To contribute, donate, establish, or maintain hostels and /or Boarding Houses and grant for free Boarding and lodging to poor deserving students and other persons and children upon such terms as the trustees may think fit.

सक्षम के दशकपूर्ति कार्यक्रम में उपस्थित रहकर इस कार्यक्रम की कुछ विशेषताओं का अनुभव करते हुए मुझे बड़ा आनंद हो रहा है, क्यों की 7-8 वर्ष पहले दिव्यांगों के विषय लेकर चिंतन, प्रयास, प्रयोग सही सब चले और बाद में सक्षम इस नाम से यह कार्य प्रारंभ हुआ और दस साल के अवधि में इसका एक सुन्दर, पर्याप्त बड़ा ऐसा अखिल भारतीय रूप इस अधिवेशन में हम सबको अनुभव हो रहा है। यह पहली विशेषता है। जो कार्य हाथ में लिया है वह बड़ा कठिन है तो भी कार्यकर्ताओं के परिश्रम के कारण देशव्यापी संगठन खड़ा हुआ। जीवन के हर क्षेत्र में शासन और समाज को same page पर होना चाहिए, ऐसा मिलता नहीं है, यहाँ पर मिल रहा है, यह भी एक बहुत अच्छी बात है और दिव्यांगों के लिए एक बहुत बड़ा शुभ संकेत है। यह दुसरी विशेषता है।

लेकिन यह पहला चरण हो गया की अखिल भारतीय रचना खड़ी हो गई। परन्तु बहुत आगे जाना पड़ेगा, यहाँ तक जाना है की दिव्यांगता समस्या के रूप में हमारे समाज में ना रहे इसलिए कुछ बातों को समाज को समझना चाहिए कुछ बातें कार्यकर्ताओं की समझनी चाहिए। यह तो समाज का कर्तव्य है, समाज इसको करने के लिए सक्षम बने। पहले हम करेंगे तो यह काम होगा, इसलिए हम पहले कर रहे हैं। इसके पीछे आत्मीयता की प्रेरणा है, ये हमारे समाज का अंग है, सारे समाज के साथ इनको बराबरी में खड़ा करना चाहिये। दिव्यांगों की समस्या होना यह हमारे लिए एक कलंक है। दिव्यांगों की समस्या केवल सक्षम की समस्या नहीं सारे समाज की समस्या है। पुरे समाज का हाथ लगने से ही इस समस्या का पूर्ण निदान होगा। दूसरी बात है, हर एक काम का स्वरूप अपनी अपनी प्रकृति के अनुसार रहता है। इसके अनुसार कार्यकर्ताओं की आदते और कार्यपद्धति की स्वस्थता महत्त्वपूर्ण है। इसके लिए

1. संगठन की अनुशासन अनिवार्य पालन करना है
2. हमारा काम संगठन का है, संगठन यानि सब मिलकर काम करे और मिलकर काम करते रहे। Coming together is beginning, working together is progress and staying together is success.

3. जैसा विनोबाजी ने कहा कार्यकर्ताओं की कार्यशीलता और चिंतनशीलता दोनों संतुलित परिणाम में साथ साथ जब बढ़ती है, तब कार्य स्वस्थ रूप में चलता है और यशस्वी होता है।
4. प्रत्येक कार्यकर्ता में प्रतिबद्धता (commitment) आवश्यक है। प्रतिबद्धता यानि अपने आप को कार्य के साथ बांध लेना, कार्य के साथ हम बंध गए तो फिर जो कार्य का होगा।

अब मैं निश्चित रूप से कह सकता हू की सक्षम का काम इस स्तर पर आ गया है की उसकी बातें समाज में, शासन में, प्रशासन में और सहयोगी कार्यकर्ताओं में भी गंभीरता पूर्वक ली जायेगी। इस अनुकूलता में हम सर्वव्यापी बनें और दिव्यांगों की आवश्यकताएँ पूर्ण करें। इसके अनुसार हमारे संगठन की रचना कार्यक्रम योजना करे। इतना बड़ा अधिवेशन हमने कर लिया तो इतना बड़ा दायित्व भी हम चाहे या ना चाहे हम पर आ गया। अब उसको पूरा करने के सिवाय दूसरा कोई चारा नहीं है। लेकिन यह compulsion नहीं है। It is a matter of love. अपनत्व के भाव के बल पर ही हम आगे की जिम्मेदारी निभा सकेंगे। इस अपनत्व की संवेदना से सारा समाज एकत्रित होगा, वह दिव्यांगों पर सिमित नहीं रहेगी संपूर्ण विश्व के लिए हो जायेगी। इसी संवेदना में से विश्वगुरु भारत खड़ा करने का कृतित्व यह समाज दिखा सकेगा। अपने कार्य की संपूर्ण सफल परिणति भी शीघ्रतापूर्वक प्राप्त हो, ऐसा बल और प्रेरणा आपको भगवान दे।
